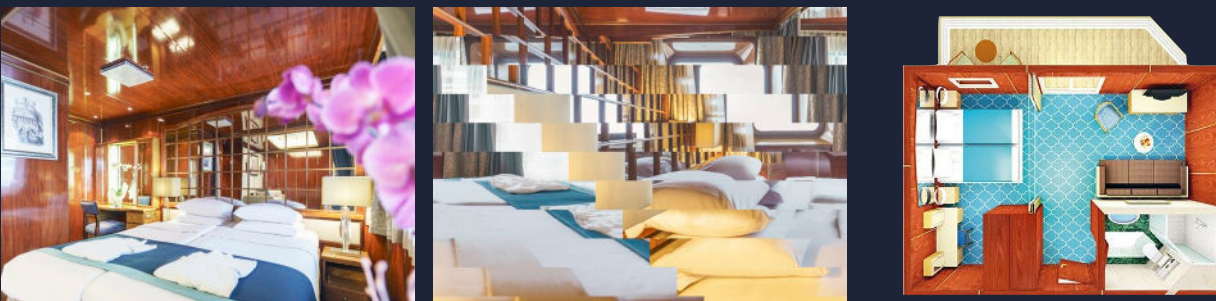

DAILY ITINERARY & ACTIVITIES



DAY 1 FRIDAY: FEB 6

We will meet in Buenos Aires, Argentina's vibrant capital city, renowned for its rich culture and lively atmosphere. Here, we will enjoy Shabbat with the local Jewish community, sharing in Shabbat meals and engaging experiences. This day is designed for settling in, relaxing, and getting oriented while taking in the unique energy of this dynamic city. Our stay will be in a centrally located hotel, within walking distance to the Synagogue and Shabbat meals, offering an enriching and inspiring experience in the heart of Buenos Aires.

DAY 2 SHABBAT: FEB 7

Spend a memorable Shabbat in Buenos Aires, home to a vibrant Jewish community of around 250,000—the largest in the country and the eighth-largest in the world. The community is a mix of Western, Central, and Eastern European Ashkenazi Jews, along with a Sephardic minority, primarily of Syrian and Lebanese descent. During our visit, we'll have the chance to connect with locals, including a special address by the community Rabbi to our group.

Take in the city's lively atmosphere as you explore its rich culture, history, and attractions. After Shabbat, we'll dive into the local nightlife with traditional folklore dancing and a night of fun.

DAY 3 SUNDAY: FEB 8

FLY TO USHUAIA AND BOARD THE SHIP

In the morning, we will take a flight from Buenos Aires to Ushuaia, the world's southernmost city and the starting point of our Antarctic expedition. Upon arrival, you will be transferred to the port area. Here, you can explore the charming waterfront and take in the stunning views of the snowcapped Martial Range, the southernmost peaks of the Andes. This is also a great opportunity for some last-minute shopping before the expedition begins. Rest assured, you'll soon receive your complimentary parka and be provided with waterproof boots for use on board.

We will then transfer to the pier, where you will be warmly welcomed aboard the deluxe expedition vessel, M/V Sea Spirit. Settle into your spacious suite and familiarize yourself with the ship, your home for this extraordinary journey. As we set sail, the adventure begins with a schedule of briefings and introductions from the expedition team. After enjoying the first of many gourmet dinners on board, step out onto the open deck to take in the breathtaking scenery and the beautiful evening light as we pass through the iconic Beagle Channel.



DAILY ITINERARY & ACTIVITIES

DAY 4-5: FEB 9-10

CROSSING THE DRAKE

After passing the breathtaking islands of Tierra del Fuego, we head south to begin our crossing of the renowned Drake Passage, where we'll keep an eye out for humpback and fin whales. Along the way, you'll likely spot the majestic wandering albatross and other graceful subantarctic seabirds, commonly seen from our panoramic open decks and balconies. As we cross the Antarctic Convergence, the natural boundary of the Southern Ocean, the ship's advanced stabilizers ensure a comfortable journey throughout. During this time, our expert lecture staff will provide briefings, bio-security procedures, and engaging presentations to prepare you for our arrival in Antarctica. We expect to reach the South Shetland Islands by Tuesday evening.

DAY 6-10: FEB 11-15 SOUTH SHETLAND ISLANDS & ANTARCTIC PENINSULA

In the coming days, we will delve into the stunning highlights of the South Shetland Islands and the Antarctic Peninsula. This region boasts some of Antarctica's most breathtaking scenery and offers unparalleled wildlife viewing. Sheltered bays and channels are adorned with glistening ice, reflecting majestic snow-capped mountains and immense glaciers. Icebergs of various shapes and sizes enhance

the region's extraordinary beauty. The nutrient-rich waters teem with marine mammals and seabirds, while penguins are seen both foraging at sea and forming large rookeries on land. We will also encounter Antarctic research bases from various nations.

Our journey will begin with the South Shetland Islands, the northernmost archipelago in Antarctica, known for its historical landing sites and abundant wildlife. We will then explore the stunning Gerlache Strait area of the Antarctic Peninsula, a pristine wilderness characterized by spectacular white landscapes, colossal icebergs, accommodating marine mammals, and bustling penguin colonies. One highlight will be the renowned Lemaire Channel, often referred to as the "Kodak Gap" for its photogenic reflection of the sheer snowy peaks.

During our expedition, we will encounter extensive colonies of gentoo, chinstrap, and Adélie penguins, frequently found in proximity to one another. This period is perfect for observing inquisitive penguin chicks as they begin to fledge. Additionally, as it is peak whale season, you can anticipate remarkable sightings of these magnificent creatures.

In this rugged yet accessible environment, wildlife viewing is best enhanced by active adventures. Our expert guides will offer hiking and hill climbing to

provide a broader perspective of this pristine polar landscape. Sea kayakers will have the opportunity to paddle amidst seals and penguins in some of the most scenic waterways in the world. For a truly immersive experience, consider spending a night camping ashore, surrounded by the untouched nature of Antarctica.

This expedition promises an authentic exploration experience. Our route and exploration opportunities will be adapted based on weather and ice conditions, with our experienced captain and expedition leader continuously adjusting plans to maximize the advantages of this challenging polar environment.



DAILY ITINERARY & ACTIVITIES

DAY 11-12: FEB 16-17 SAIL THE DRAKE PASSAGE

As we return across the Drake Passage toward South America, the adventure continues. Seabirds will remain our constant companions, and there is always the chance of whale sightings in these rugged waters. This is also the time for final festivities, including the Captain's Farewell Cocktail and an end-of-voyage slideshow. As we navigate the Beagle Channel, we will enjoy a night of smooth sailing en route to Ushuaia.



DAY 13 WEDNESDAY: FEB 18 DISEMBARKATION IN USHUAIA, ARGENTINA

Following a final delightful breakfast on board, we will bid you a heartfelt farewell in Ushuaia. We will arrange a group transfer to the airport for your flight back to Buenos Aires (included). 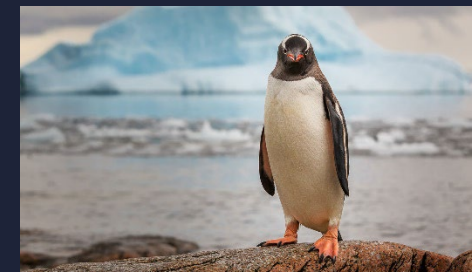

GENTOO PENGUIN

Gentoo is the largest of all Pygoscelis penguins. It can be easily recognized by the wide

white stripe extending like a bonnet across the top of its head and the red bill. Chicks have grey backs with white fronts. They are the fastest underwater swimming penguins, reaching speeds of 36 km/h. They feed mainly on krill, but also on fish and squid. They are the most numerous penguins nesting in the Antarctic region.



CHINSTRAP PENGUIN

Chinstraps are similar to Adelies in that they are black and white, but they are slightly smaller and have a distinctive black line connecting the black cap to the part below the chin. They are highly gregarious and monogamous. It is believed they form long-lasting bonds with their mates. They nest in the Antarctic Peninsula area and on Subantarctic Islands. Their population is estimated in 7.5 million pairs, being the second largest of Antarctic inhabitants after the gentoo penguins.

ADELIE PENGUIN

The Adelie is the archetypical penguin, named after French explorer Dumont D'Urville's wife. They are purely black and white, with a characteristic angular head, a distinctive white eye-ring and a tiny bill. Females are smaller in size, but like all penguins, the sexes are alike. The downy chick is uniformly grey.



BLACK-BROWED ALBATROSS

The black-browed albatross is one of the smaller black and white 'mollymawks' with a pale head. This albatross can be identified at a distance by its underwing pattern featuring a wide dark leading edge. At close range, the adult birds have a yellow eye that makes identification easy.

HUMPBACK WHALE

Humpbacks may be recognized by their enormous flippers, which can reach a third of their total body length. They are normally black, but the undersides of flippers and flukes have varying amounts of white and can be used as aids for individual recognition. They measure 11 to 19 meters and weigh 25.4-35.5 tonnes. Males are usually slightly shorter than females.

ELEPHANT SEAL

The southern elephant seal is the world's largest seal. It is a heavy-built, long-body seal with proportionately small flippers and some skin folds just behind the head. The dark eyes are large and round. The adults have short stiff hair, usually dark grey dorsally and paler ventrally. Males have squarer and larger heads, with a conspicuous proboscis, while females have more rounded heads with no proboscis. Breeding males may weigh up to a sixth that of a breeding female. Males can grow to 4.5-6.5 meters and 3,700 kg; females can grow to 2.5-4 meters and between 360-800 kg.

WHICH ANIMALS DO WE SEE ON OUR EXPEDITION?



CRABEATER SEAL

They are relatively slim and flexible, typically with an elongated, square-shaped head, protruding dog-like snout, a long mouth opening and large flippers. Their eyes are dark and small. The coloration is predominantly dark brown dorsally becoming blond ventrally, with a marked seasonal and individual variation in coat color. With age, fur gradually becomes uniformly blond after the molt. Many are deeply scarred on the back and body-sides due to attacks by leopard seals and killer whales. Crabeaters actually eat krill, not crabs, as their name suggests.

LEOPARD SEAL

These seals have long slim bodies, with an almost serpentine appearance and comparatively large reptilian heads with a long snout, powerful jaws, broad gape and relatively small dark eyes. Fore flippers are rather large, situated near the centre of the body. They have very long canine teeth, with long pointed cusps on the molar teeth. Females are larger than males (3.8 meters and 500 kg compared to 2.8-3.8 meters and 300 kg).

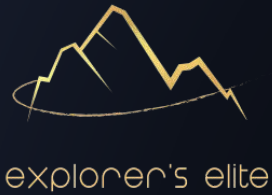

Frequently Asked Questions...

When is the best time to take an Antarctic cruise?

The Antarctic summer (November to March) offers milder temperatures, abundant wildlife, and stunning ice formations. Early season (November-December) provides snow-covered landscapes, while late season (February-March) offers whale sightings and mesmerizing sunsets. No matter when you choose, an Antarctic expedition cruise promises awe-inspiring scenery and unforgettable adventures.

Travel arrangements

Depending on your nationality, you may require a visa to enter Argentina. Please check with your local Consulate.

A typical day aboard our expedition ship

We want to show you the best of the Antarctic and its most breathtaking places. Weather permitting, we will land on pristine shores, walk to beautiful viewpoints and cruise in our small motorized Zodiac boats. Join the kayak club and you can paddle close-up to wildlife and nature at your own pace. But even at days at sea, ship life aboard the Sea Spirit will keep you busy. Visit lectures by our specialists, hit the gym, read books about Antarctica in our polar library, enjoy gourmet meals in our Kosher restaurant, meet fellow travelers at the bar or in our coffee and tea lounge, or just enjoy the beautiful views from your comfortable cabin.

When stepping ashore...

While you already get the best views from our small expedition ship, the Sea Spirit, cruising ashore with our Zodiac boats will bring you even closer to the action. These motorized, safe and durable boats are designed for a maximum of 16 passengers and are perfect for ecologically-sound cruising, minimizing your impact on nature and wildlife.

Visit the captain's bridge to be the first one to spot wildlife. Pick up binoculars, chat with the crew, or just simply enjoy the best views from this part of the ship. We bring top scientists aboard and encourage our passengers to participate in their research.

Visit our gym whenever you feel the need to stretch your legs or take a stroll on deck and take in the fresh ocean breeze.

Do I need travel insurance?

Yes, you will require travel insurance that covers you for the duration of the cruise. Please ensure that it includes travel to the polar regions and has an evacuation and repatriation coverage. While we do not require it, we encourage passengers to also have cancellation health and luggage insurance.

What important things should I consider when traveling to Antarctica?

1. Choose your expedition ship wisely! To get the full experience and make the most of wildlife sightings, landings and activities, join a cruise with less than 200 passengers. You'll get a more personal experience, get closer to the action and form closer bonds with like-minded fellow travelers!
2. Cruise with the best! Choose a company that has many years of experience with a top team. This is important to guarantee your safety and the trip of our lifetime! How far in advance do I need to book an Antarctic cruise?

To secure the best cabins it's recommended to book your Antarctica cruise as early as possible. Availability is limited, and by booking well in advance, you increase your chances of choosing your preferred dates, accommodations, and enjoying cost-saving benefits. Don't delay, it is high time to visit Antarctica! Start planning your extraordinary Antarctica cruise today!

What clothes do I need to bring?

We recommend layering your clothes, so you can add or subtract based on weather conditions. Start with warm thermal undergarments made from merino wool or synthetics (not cotton), layer with polar fleece, wool and finish off with water and windproof materials. Keep your body warm, but let it breathe! Don't forget your hats, scarves and gloves. We'll have our warm expedition parka ready for you aboard, which you can take home with you, as well as rubber boots for landings, which are yours for the duration of the trip.

How much luggage can I bring?

It's always best to pack for the segment of your flight itinerary that has the smallest baggage allowance requirement - baggage allowances on international flights are often larger than domestic flights. Also, be sure to check with your airline to confirm what you are allowed to carry.

The Sea Spirit has laundry facilities. Baggage allowance onboard is 1 suitcase 23kg and 1 trolley 8kg. Closer to sailing departure we will send you a more comprehensive and recommended packing list

Will there be Wi-Fi, phones or mobile coverage aboard?

Our expedition ship, the Sea Spirit, is equipped with Wi-Fi, which is included in the cruise package.

What do I do if I get seasick?

Not all Drake Passage crossings are rough, but individuals may react differently to the occasional choppy waters. It is recommended that passengers consult with their physician before traveling to Antarctica. Preventative sea sickness pills will be available at expedition desk.

How cold will it get during my voyage?

We cruise during the Antarctic summer. On the subantarctic islands and the Antarctic Peninsula, temperatures average ,min-max 0-12°C during our cruises. The ship temperature control will be at comfortable and constant 22°C
